My 73 year old brother had surgical removal of middle & inner ears about 50 years ago due to chronic infection.

The other (left) ear hearing gradually deteriorated, resulting in a variety of hearing aids, till modern aural surgery techniques gave him his hearing back. His wife had a global stroke 4 months ago & he is now her full time carer. Adapting to domestic skills plus the needs of his wife have been paramount for him, & recently he lost all hearing, which was a devastating experience for him. At first Sound therapy was in the "too hard basket" for him to cope with, but when I visited him 2 weeks ago, he was so desperate he agreed to use the equipment. Three days later he had more than 50% of his hearing. I have not been able to contact him since but will endeavour to visit him again this coming week & keep you posted as to the success or otherwise of his continued use of Sound Therapy.

Even though I have not been a very active distributor I am glad I had the equipment for him when he needed it.

Dear Marion,

I would like to give you some feedback on my experience with using the music sound therapy.

I have been using it with great success for my well being during the work I do in a communications call centre.

This work entails continual answering calls for pager systems and mobile phone SMS messages and typing up the messages. Anything from 4 to 8 hours at a time.

Needless to say it creates stress on ears, nervous agitation and is a demand on the body sitting for such long periods without body movement.

I started using the sound therapy under my earphones several months ago on a very low level hardly audible. I have noticed such a difference. My hearing has improved, it soothes the harsh noise bombarding the ears causing nervous agitation which impaired my hearing allowing me to use a low volume on earphones now.

I have not been to a doctor to have my ears cleaned of wax build up since using the therapy. I only developed this condition after working at the Call Centre for a while.

Efficiency is greatly improved and even at the end of an 8 hour shift I don't have that jarred anxiety and my ears are soothed.

There is no way I would still be working at this type of work without the help of the sound therapy.

Dear Raquelle, & Helen

Am writing in response to Helen's recent request.

'Our son, (who will be 11 in December) has aspergers syndrome, nystagmus (constant eye movement), ^{and} an unusual gait.

In April 05 he started listening to the basic tapes. Of his own volition he said the "tapes calmed his brain." Within a fortnight I noticed an improvement in his behaviour.'

'After about 8 weeks (he had well over 300 listening hours) he progressed to "Emotional Balance." After about another 6~~or~~ weeks he no longer wet the bed every night and after another 2-3 weeks was dry completely. His behavior has improved vastly and his walking has greatly improved.'
